DEPUTY PRINCIPAL

It was great to see the Year 9 students who along with the Big Day out featured in this newsletter were fully engaged with their orientation and induction to a broad range of areas across the school during the first half of Week 2. As part of their induction, they were given the opportunity to find out more about key areas around the school including the Health and Careers department, to find out more about our whare (Te Poho o Rongokako) as well as be inducted into the use of our digital infrastructure through their laptops.

It was pleasing to see that 90% of our current Year 9 students have managed to bring a laptop to school this year which is a great start to the year. We will also be making contact with some families to see if we can work towards getting easier access to a laptop to make their son or daughters educational experience around the use of technology more accessible both at school and at home.

As part of their induction to getting connected to the school network through their laptops, they were also guided through the steps to familiarise themselves with other aspects of our digital network including logging into the library and accessing our entire collection online, being able to link to their timetables, attendance and school notices as well as set up their personal school email addresses.

We understand that giving students access to the internet and a range of digital tools will work alongside their education in the classroom and at home. We are also aware that this brings with it many challenges and the primary one is that of safety online for our students. As part of the induction, we do discuss this aspect. A Netsafe refresher course will be held on Thursday 19 March for staff from 3:30 - 5:00pm. Following this we would like to offer our parents the opportunity to have an insight to the world of a teenager and their activity through the internet with a presentation from Netsafe at school from 6:30pm - 8:00pm on the Thursday evening.

DEPUTY PRINCIPAL - CURRICULUM & ASSESSMENT

Tēnā koutou kātoa e te Karamu whanau.

It has been a real privilege and honour to be appointed as Deputy Principal in charge of Curriculum and Assessment in 2020. It was also a pleasure to have our Year 12 and 13 students and their whanau come in before school started for Course Confirmation to reflect on their 2019 NCEA results, discuss their career aspirations, set goals and confirm their courses.

Now it is important to set goals around:

- Regular attendance
- Quality time management
- · Meeting milestones
- Striving for academic best
- Communicating with teachers so they can support your needs

Staff have created courses with students' best interests in mind, that cater for ability, interest and pathways. It is therefore very important that all assessments and milestone deadlines be met by the due date. The Karamu Website site will soon have an Assessment Calendar of assessment dates for each course. Please use this with your child to plan.

Homework should also be a regular event for all high school students. Actively going over their work between lessons and checking their understanding will help them achieve to their true potential. In the junior school at least 30 minutes per night and in the senior school one hour is recommended. Information retention drops significantly within the first 24 hours unless time is taken to process the learning. To support this, we have Homework Club. This is held in the library Tuesday and Thursday 3:00pm - 4:00pm and Wednesday 8:30am -9:00am for students wishing to take advantage of a safe, warm (or cool!), digitally friendly space with support from our fantastic academic leaders. I look forward to working with students and whanau in 2020.

Cortez Te Pou (2015-2019)

We were all very impressed with Cortez's success in Rugby, Rugby 7's and Touch last year. In Rugby she was selected for New Zealand Maori Under 18 Team, represented and played for the Hawke's Bay Rugby Under 18 and the Hawke's Bay Women's Tuis. She represented and played Hawke's Bay Under 18 and Women's Rugby 7's and in Touch she was selected and played in the Whanganui Touch Under 18 mixed and then trialled for the New Zealand Under 20 mixed side.

However, the pinnacle of her year was selection in the New Zealand Secondary School's Condor 7's side who played in the World Championships in Auckland in December. A great achievement to round off a great year on the field. This year she is off to Japan on a three month playing contract in 7's and hopes to continue her success in 15s for the Hawke's Bay Tui's when she returns. Jonathon Krebs (1977 - 1981)

Jonathan Krebs has been appointed a District Court Judge, sworn in on 1 October 2019 in Napier and will be based in Palmerston North. Krebs has been a barrister sole since late 2006 and has chambers in Napier and Auckland. He was with Langley Twigg Solicitors

(Napier) from 1988 to 1998. From late 1998 he was a senior prosecutor with Meredith Connell (Auckland). He commenced practice as a barrister in 2001 and for eight months he was a panel member of the Auckland Crown Solicitor.

Krebs represented Teina Pora, jailed for the 1992 rape and murder of Susan Burdett, when he took his case to the Privy Council in London in 2014. The Privy Council quashed Pora's convictions the following year.

He was a partner of the Hawke's Bay Crown solicitors, Elvidge & Partners, from 2002 to 2006 before being seconded to the Attorney-General's Office in Apia, Samoa, for two months at the end of 2006.

The principal focus of his career has been criminal and civil litigation. He was the Convenor of the NZLS Criminal Law Subcommittee for 10 years and is a past President of the Hawke's Bay District Law Society. In 2012 he was Director of the New Zealand Law Society Litigation Skills programme. (Sourced from Stuff, Aug 30 2019)


